• A GB sticker is compulsory when driving in Lithuania, even on vehicles displaying Euro style plates  
• Wearing your seat belt is compulsory (front and back)  
• Use of winter tyres is compulsory between November and March  
• Dipped head lamps must be used during the daytime from September to March  
• Children under 12 or 1.5m are forbidden to travel in the front seat without a child restraint. Children under 3 must be seated in a child seat appropriate to their age and size in the rear seats

• UK registered vehicles displaying Euro-plates (circle of 12 stars above the national identifier on blue background) are no longer obligated to affix a GB sticker to the rear of the vehicle when driving in Luxembourg  
• No motorway tolls charged  
• Drivers who passed their test less than 2 years ago cannot exceed 75kmh  
• Children under 3 must be seated in an approved restraint system. Children aged 3-17 or under 1.5m must be seated in appropriate restraint system

• UK registered vehicles displaying Euro-plates (circle of 12 stars above the national identifier on blue background) are no longer obligated to affix a GB sticker to the rear of the vehicle when driving in France  
• Wearing your seat belt is compulsory  
• Saliva drug tests will be used to detect drivers under the influences of drugs

• EC model format UK Licences (pink or pink/green) accepted. Holders of old style green licences require an International Driving Permit when driving any vehicle in Portugal  
• Driver must be 17 years or over  
• A Camping Card International is recommended  
• Motorists should carry evidence of motor insurance (insurance certificate). Third party cover is compulsory. For further advice please contact your insurance company  
• UK registered vehicles displaying Euro-plates (circle of 12 stars above the national identifier on blue background) are no longer obligated to affix a GB sticker to the rear of the vehicle when driving in Portugal  
• Wearing your seat belt is compulsory

• Foreign motorists must take out short term insurance at the border. Third party insurance is compulsory, fully comprehensive insurance is recommended  
• A GB sticker is compulsory when driving in Russia, even on vehicles displaying Euro style plates  
• Wearing your seat belt is compulsory (front and back)  
• Drivers who passed their test less than 2 years ago cannot exceed 70kmh  
• The use of horns in urban areas is prohibited  
• Picking up hitch-hikers is prohibited  
• Any visitor whose vehicle is involved in an accident or a breakdown must also contact the militia in addition to any breakdown cover organisation  
• It is against the law to drive a dirty car, where the registration is not legible.

• A GB sticker is compulsory when driving in San Marino, even on vehicles displaying Euro style plates

• EC model format UK Licences (pink or pink/green) accepted. Holders of old style green licences require an International Driving Permit when driving any vehicle in Spain  
• Driver must be 18 years or over  
• A Camping Card International is recommended  
• Motorists should carry evidence of motor insurance (insurance certificate). Third party cover is compulsory. For further advice please contact your insurance company
